Fraudulent Light – and the Epidemy of Oblivion

Fraudulent Light – and the Epidemy of Oblivion is based on an idea presented by art history professor Jonathan Crary in his book 24/7 (2013):

"A 24/7 world is a disenchanted one in its eradication of shadows and obscurity and of alternate temporalities. It is a world identical to itself, a world with a shallowest past and does in principle without spectators – but the homogeneity of the present is an effect of the fraudulent brightness that presumes to extend everywhere and pre-empt any mystery or unknowability."

If one takes Crary's proposal seriously and sees the world situation as an unhistorical, transparent illusion, how can dance in such a world make visible its own past? And what points of contact does that past have with the present?

This is the point of departure for *Fraudulent Light – and the Epidemy of Oblivion*. It is a work for nine performers and its artistic inspiration stems from the choreographies *Sacre du Printemps* (1975), *1980 – Ein Stück von Pina Bausch* (1980) and *Walzer* (1982) by Pina Bausch and the Tanztheater Wuppertal. The original members of the Tanztheater Wuppertal performing these works appear very human in their cruelty and rage, morphing into humour, kindness, and playful self-irony. 50 years after their completion these iconic performances have been a source of inspiration, an instigation to discourse and partially also sources for material.

Fraudulent Light – and the Epidemy of Oblivion is a co-production by Liisa Pentti +Co and Sirius Teatern. The performance genre could be called "ghost theatre". The choreographic idea is based on the act of remembering and reflects existing forms and ideas in performing arts, events that have been taking place a long time ago. Through its reflection of the past and its gifts something new is engendered. Fraudulent Light – and the Epidemy of Oblivion opens a fabric of scenes, visions and premonitions, recollections and experiences. It is a field of constantly erupting actions, where tragedy and entertainment emerge side by side in an anthropocentric network of events, as when a performer's love for a chair overcomes the gulf between human and object while a memory of surrendering to free fall serves as the basis for the movement material.

Fraudulent Light – and the Epidemy of Oblivion is also a performance about touch and the lack of it, insomnia, bodily metamorphoses, the possibility of dance, and probabilities of the future; about the passage of time and melancholy, associations and absurd encounters, chaos and surrendering to it, and most of all about trust in the existence of shadows.
